# HOCHSTEIN NEAR DAHN

## PHOTO SPOTS IN THE WEST PALATINATE

#### MOTIF-DESCRIPTION -

East of Dahn is the 345 m high Hochstein. It is one of the numerous red sandstone formations that are predominantly found in this area. The rock chain of the Hochstein stretches over a length of about 1.5 km. The western end of the massif, the Hochstein Needle, is particularly striking. This is followed by the Gratturm and the actual Hochstein ridge, after which further foothills continue to the north-east and south.

#### DIRECTIONS AND LOCATION

From the Haus am Kurpark in Dahn to the end of Priminiusstraße, then turn right onto the paved path and follow the path to the German war gravesite. From there, a marked path runs steeply uphill for about 600 m to the plateau of the Hochstein (past a rock shelter called Soldatenhütte).


