

MOTIF-DESCRIPTION

The Japanese Garden in Kaiserslautern is the largest enclosed Japanese garden in the whole of Europe and was also the first in Rhineland-Palatinate. With an area of approx. 13,500 sqm, it not only impresses with its size, but also captivates with its authentic ambience and design. With its opening in 2000, an exotic garden paradise was created near Lauter's city centre.

DIRECTIONS AND LOCATION

Access is possible via Lauterstraße, parking spaces are located around the town hall. The Japanese Garden is well signposted from there and the entrance is in a dead-end street directly opposite the Kaiserslautern district administration.

Polarising filter and soft grey gradient GND 16, GND 8 depending on light conditions



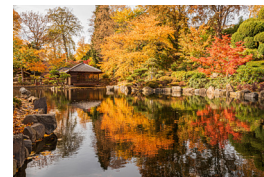
