PHOTO SPOTS IN THE WEST PALATINATE

MOTIF-DESCRIPTION -

Especially the Rauhfels and the Geiersteine offer spectacular motifs on autumn days with a little ground fog. The typical weathered Palatinate sandstone characterises the landscape in this area, and other dreamlike photo motifs, such as the Falkenburg, can be found in this region.

— DIRECTIONS AND LOCATION —

Coming from Wilgartswiesen, take the first road on the right in Spirkelbach (Felsenstraße). At the end of this road, where the asphalt road also ends, is a small car park. Opposite the car park, a path begins that later turns into a trail and leads quite steeply up to the Rauhfels. It is about 650 m from the car park to the plateau of the Rauhfels.
