MOTIF-DESCRIPTION —

After uncovering the complex, one can clearly see the foundation walls of the once two-nave building made of red sandstone, as well as the square choir, above which the tower probably rose. The main nave, divided into four bays, is twelve metres long and around six metres wide. The side aisle added to the south is about three metres wide. The best preserved are three squat and massive pillars that separate the nave and side aisles. On top of the pillars are rectangular ceiling slabs and pointed-ending separating arches, which formerly supported the ceiling vault. The total height of the room may have been about five metres.

— DIRECTIONS AND LOCATION —————

Coming from Landstuhl, the Verena Chapel is located on the main road shortly after entering Mittelbrunn. The best way to reach the somewhat hidden chapel is via the L469 from Landstuhl-Atzel, which crosses the A62.

16-35 mm, 24-70 mm, 12 mm fixed focus



Polarising filter, sky filter and soft grey gradient GND 16, GND 8 depending on light conditions to darken the sky.

Approx 30 m next to a farm, a path leads up to the chapel ruins on the right-hand side. It is best to choose your photo position there so that the round arches lead as a line to the camera. A wide-angle lens, e.g. 12-24 mm, is very suitable for this. The position of the photo shown was just before the farm wall.


